More than 90 percent of PC(USA) members identify themselves as Caucasian and the average age of Presbyterians is fifty-five years old; 68 percent of Americans identify themselves as Caucasian and the average age of Americans is about forty-five years old. Our denomination does not reflect the demographic realities of our world. What can we do as people of faith to open our doors wider so that all of God's people feel welcome?

One of the ways this disparity between what is within our doors and what is outside our doors is being addressed is through the Racial Ethnic Young Adult Leadership (REYAL) Ministry Team. REYAL is working to make more diverse denomination a reality. Two individuals from each organized racial ethnic young adult councils meet annually to share stories, celebrate blessings, pray for the denomination, and discern their role in the future. They develop resources that lift up the unheard voices of racial ethnic young adults and equip them with tools for evangelism and discipleship.

The Session took the following actions at its monthly meeting on April 9th.

The April Stated meeting was held in the Church Conference room. The following were present and constituted a quorum: the Moderator, Rev. Georgia King, and Elders Leah Buckland, Margaret Edgington, Harold Hebermehl, Hazel Howard, and Julia Kasch. Treasured Pam Nicholas was also present. The meeting was convened at 11:50 with a devotional by Mrs. Howard and a prayer by Moderator King.

Minutes of the March meeting were reviewed by the Clerk, a motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept these minutes as presented.

Letters received of note were reviewed: A) Wills Emphasis Sunday and B) a Mission Support application sent from Presbytery. We do not make special note of Wills Emphasis Sunday in our congregation. The Mission Support deadline is too near to be of practical use this year, however it will be noted for congregation's program next year.

The Treasurer reports of March were reviewed and seconded, and passed to accept these reports as presented. The status of Carol Mills, the new custodian, was discussed. She will be considered an employee and salary and tax data will be reported accordingly.

There was not report from the Community Committee. The Worship Committee discussed a speaker from the Gideon's to be the guest pastor April 23rd. Most of May is also set. The communion schedule for the year will be discussed at the May meeting.

For Christian Nurture, June Voigt will be in charge of the children's Sunday school classes during the June- August period, with Leah Buckland beginning in September.

For the Property committee, Jerry Pool will look into repair of the Parlor ceiling. Also the main entrance ceiling needs replacement.

Pat Petty will continue to serve as organist and choir director until Scott Glenn returns.
