Dear Friends;

I think that this is the year for blessings. Now this may not sound like much of a blessing but - - - when I looked at the 2011 calendar and saw that Ash Wednesday wasn't until March 9<sup>th</sup> and Easter isn't until April 24<sup>th</sup>, I felt truly blessed! It felt as though I had been given an extra month to get everything in order for our Lenten journey – yes, yours and mine. Lent takes us to Easter, to the celebration and experience of the new life that Jesus won for us on the cross - but what does that mean to you, where you are today?

In Lent we acknowledge our brokenness, our sin, our mistakes - AND own up to the consequences! We can't blame God or others - just humbly open ourselves up to God and ask forgiveness. That's HARD! When we acknowledge that, despite the image we try to project, we just might actually have had SOME responsibility for the messes our lives can get in. THAT'S the beginning of change, of new life.

So, this is where you and your story come in... What brokenness has touched your life? If you're like most of us, you won't have to look too hard to find something - health, family, job, relationships, or even in your personal life. Ask God to strip away the excuses, arrogance, fear and pride - and then ask him to give forgiveness and healing. I promise your journey will almost instantly change - and it may even get more difficult for a time as you are now bringing out in front of your journey those issues that need attention (instead of ignoring them or blaming others - including God).

"More difficult" is NOT all bad - it means that we are dealing with hard things - and if we DON'T deal with them, they will deal with us - and that will NOT be pleasant.

Help and support for the hard parts of your journey is here and available - Just ASK!

As we begin this journey, let us begin with prayer:

***Father in heaven, the light of your truth bestows sight to the darkness of sinful eyes.***

***May this season of repentance bring us the blessing of your forgiveness***

## Session Actions

### Borger, Texas Stated Session Meeting January 16, 2011

Stated Session meeting was held in the church Conference Room beginning at 11:40 am with prayer. The Rev. Jennifer Santer served as Moderator due to the illness of Rev. Georgia King. Also present were Phyllis Harmony, Hazel Howard, Julia Kasch, Jerry Pool, and Pat Petty. Treasurer Pam Nicholas was also present. Elder and Session Clerk Hal Hebermehl was absent.

CLERK: Minutes from the December 2010 meeting were reviewed and approved by a motion from Elder Harmony and a second by Elder Kasch. No communications at the present time.

TREASURER: There was no monthly report for the month of December. That report will be available to the Session at the January 2011 meeting. The budget for 2011 was discussed. One change needs to be made for the outdoor sign. That amount was listed at \$1500.00 and should be changed to \$4000.00. The higher amount was preferred by the Session. The monies will come from the Memorial Fund designated for outdoor sign in memory of Bobby Farrell. The remainder of the funds will come from the Sue Sharpe bequeath. The Budget for 2011 was approved with a motion by Elder Pool and a second by Elder Petty. The budget will be presented to the congregation on February 13, 2011 at the annual Congregational Meeting.

PASTOR REPORT: Rev. King continues to improve and plans on coming back to the pulpit on January 30, 2011. She and Rev. Santer will fill the pulpit that day.

COMMITTEES:

WORSHIP: Communion for February will be February 13, 2011.

PROPERTY: Elder Pool reported that construction continues on the remodeling of bathrooms. He anticipates that the crew will be completely done by the end of January. A gas leak was discovered and repaired.

STEWARDSHIP: Budget for 2011 is complete. It will be presented to the congregation on February 13, 2011.

FELLOWSHIP: There will be no dinners planned except for the Congregational Annual Meeting on February 13, 2011. Elder Pool will furnish the hamburgers. The congregation will bring the rest.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION: One Great Hour of Sharing is April 4, 2011. Envelopes will be placed in the pews for that.

There was no New Business or Old Business.

Meeting adjourned at 12:31 pm with prayer.

Members attending: Jerry Pool, Phyllis Harmony, Julia Kasch, Pat Petty, Georgia King, and Pam Nicholas, treasurer. On a motion by Pat Petty, seconded by Jerry Pool, Julia Kasch will serve as interim clerk of the session until Hal Hebermehl is able to resume the duties of clerk. Motion passed.

Members were reminded that documents relating to session meetings are not published until the full session has read and approved said documents. This approval can be expressed individually by e mail to the clerk.

Old business: Members reviewed the draft of the budget to be presented to the congregation at the congregational meeting. The treasurer will make the adjustments suggested and make copies for the congregational meeting. The session feels that new budget format will increase the readability of the document.

New business: Rev. Janne Brumelow, Stated Clerk of the Palo Duro Presbytery, is retiring for health reasons. She has filled our pulpit several times in addition to her Presbytery duties. The session voted to contribute \$250.00 from our unrestricted memorial fund to assist her in her move to the Grace Presbyterian Village in the Dallas area. (Motion Pat Petty, second Phyllis Harmony, passed).

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

## Ark of the Covenant

The ark was at the center of worship for the Israelites. It contained the stone tablets of the Ten Commandments, a pot of manna and Aaron's rod. In the Old Testament, the ark was a visible representation of God's throne, or presence, on earth, where he communed with Moses and the high priests. It also represents our earthly bodies, where the Holy Spirit dwells.

## A great fit

A caller to Christian radio station KLOVE spoke of the amazing way God restored her struggling marriage. On the weekend that she and her husband separated, they each attended different services on different days at their large, multi-campus church.

For an object lesson, the pastor had purchased three 1,500-piece puzzles and given one piece to each worshiper that weekend. The woman took hers home and placed it on her dresser.

That Sunday, the husband stopped by the house to do yard work. When the woman walked by her dresser, she noticed that another puzzle piece was attached to hers – and it fit. It was the piece her husband had received at church.

The woman said that was a loud sign from God that she and her husband “fit” together and would be okay. Life and marriage aren't always perfect, but she framed the puzzle pieces “as a constant reminder to our covenant to each other” and to God's promises.

## **Living as a Christian**

It isn't easy to live the Christian life. Some years ago, Dom Helder Camera, Brazil's Roman Catholic bishop, said: "When I gave food to the poor, they called me a saint; when I asked why there were so many poor, I was called a Communist." Do good consistently, and you will pay a price sooner or later.

Jesus was sometimes considered radical. He talked to a Samaritan woman at a well. He healed and ate grain from a field on the Sabbath. He hung out with sinners.

The Pharisees and the Sadducees didn't work to get rid of Jesus because he spoke of the birds of the air and the lilies of the field. Rather, it was because he denounced the unjust leaders he called hypocrites (see Matthew 23).

Lent is a good time to recall these words of Jesus: "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me" (Matthew 16:24, NRSV).

## **The glory of spring**

A pastor looked out his study window and was smitten by the glory of spring bursting forth all around him. He recalled a story about a Jewish doctor freed from a Nazi concentration camp.

The doctor began walking along a country road and was captivated by the green meadows, the wildflowers, the singing birds. He felt touched by the master artist's work in nature. Indeed, the doctor was so moved that he knelt by the road in prayer. He decided that God was giving him a whole new life. He was becoming a healthy human being again, instead of a victim of horror and hate.

The pastor, remembering that story, praised God as he saw the earth blooming once again with indescribable beauty.

## Say yes to God

“Many think of self-denial as giving up something during the Lenten season. Others have said that it is to be dead to self, or even to hate self. I disagree with these opinions. When Jesus referred to self-denial (Mark 8:34), he was not talking about denying ourselves some luxury item or denying the reality of self or the needs of self.
