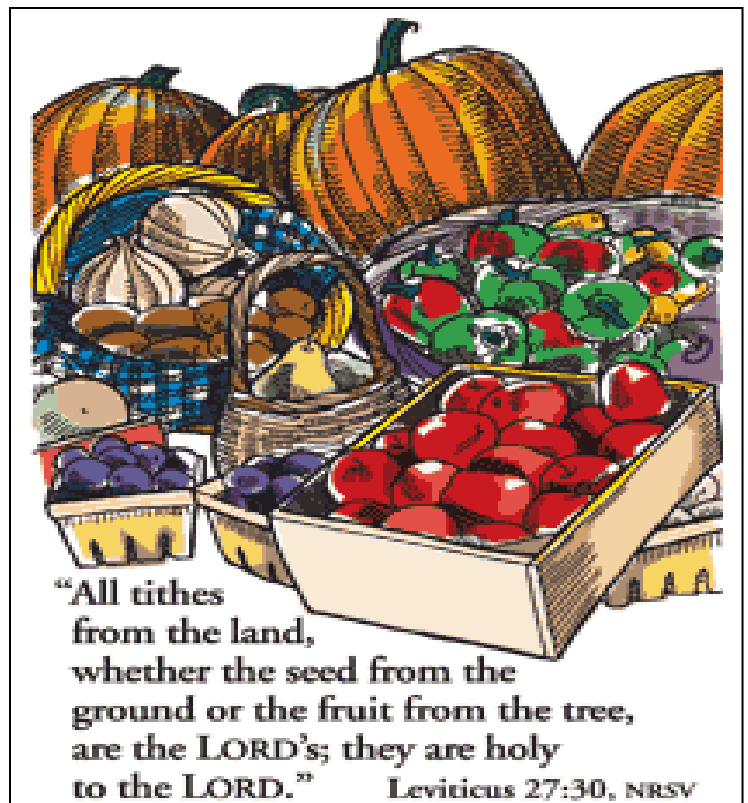

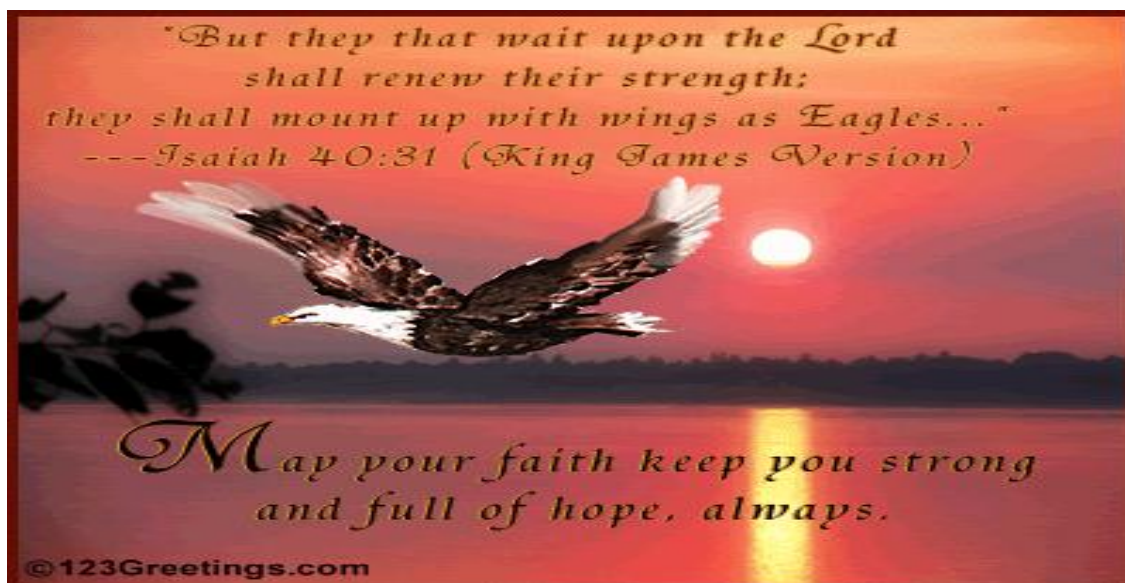

Session Actions

Borger, Texas
Stated Session Meeting
August 15, 2010

The Stated Session meeting was held in the church Conference Room, beginning with prayer at 11:50 am. The following were present and constituted a quorum: Moderator, the Rev. Georgia King and Elders Phyllis Harmony, Harold Hebermehl, Hazel Howard, Julia Kasch and Pat Petty. Elder Jerry Pool was absent. Treasurer Pam Nicholas also was present.

CLERK:

1. Minutes of the June 13, 2010 Called meeting and the June 20, 2010 Stated Session meeting were approved via a motion by Elder Harmony, seconded by Elder Kasch.
2. Several communications received over the past two months were reviewed.

TREASURER:

1. All monthly financial reports were approved as presented.

PASTOR REPORT:

1. Jim Farrell needs a contact for house cleaning; Busy Bees was suggested.
2. Rev. King will be out after October 18 to early November (traveling to Europe). Glendall Smith will substitute October 24 and Jane Brumbelow (Palo Duro Presbytery Stated Clerk) will fill the pulpit on October 31.
3. It was requested that Session and Communion dates be keep separate. The schedule for each for the next few months is:
 - A) Communion: September 12...October 3...November 21.
 - B) Stated Session: September 19...October 18...November 14...December 12.

COMMITTEES:

WORSHIP:

1. The Memorial book, listing deaths of members, has been updated and returned to the display case in the Sanctuary. Unfortunately, the quality of the work was not as good as desired. We may consider redoing the job.
2. The question arose about adding Sue Sharp to the member list. However, it has been many years since she was a member and, appropriately, she (and Martha Smith) should be included in the 'non-member, but notable donor' Book, also displayed in the Sanctuary.

FELLOWSHIP:

Presbytery will arrange for registrations. We will need to set up refreshments for break times and provide several people to assist throughout the day.
