Despite a brain tumor that took her voice for two years, Pranitha Timothy has led more than 50 rescue operations to save slaves in India. As director of aftercare for International Justice Mission, Timothy works to give “a voice to the voiceless.”

She credits God for protecting her during the dangerous missions, which have included run-ins with slave owners. “God goes before us into the places of darkness and makes the paths straight for us to bring rescue,” she says.

Although Timothy’s voice returned feebly, she says it’s powerful in God’s hands. Most importantly, she says, God has transformed her heart and filled her with compassion.

## The ultimate resolution


