Stated Session Meeting
April 17, 2011

Stated Session meeting was held in the church Conference Room beginning at 11:45 a.m. with prayer. The Rev. Georgia King served as Moderator. Also present were Elders, Phyllis Harmony, Hazel Howard, Jerry Pool, and Pat Petty, Acting Clerk. Treasurer Pam Nicholas was also present. Elder and Session Clerk Hal Hebermehl was absent along with Julia Kasch.

CLERK: Minutes from the previous meeting were approved as presented. No communications at the present time.

TREASURER: Treasurer's report was approved as presented.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Rev. King reported on a new language change for an existing regulation from Presbytery. It is in regard to ethical conduct.

COMMITTEES:

WORSHIP: There will be no Maunday Thursday service this year. Hazel Howard will serve as Duty Elder for May. Communion for May will be May 8. Session will be May 15, 2011.

PROPERTY: Elder Pool reported on the recommendation for the Special Committee regarding the repairs in the Education Wing. The committee is recommending that the existing asbestos floor tiles be removed and replaced. Motion was made by Elder Petty and seconded by Elder Harmony that the recommendation be approved and the money to be taken from the Sue Sharp bequest. Motion carried. The old bathroom behind the Deacon's room will be restored for our use with a motion from Elder Petty and second by Elder Harmony. Motion carried. Money will come from savings.

STEWARDSHIP: No report.

FELLOWSHIP: We will have a congregational meeting on May 1 with sandwiches to be served by the Fellowship committee. This meeting will be to inform our congregation of action taken in regard to the Educational Wing and bathroom behind the old Deacon's room. An ice cream social will be held in June 15, 2011.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION: Envelopes for the One Great Hour of Sharing are available in the pews in the sanctuary.

New Business is listed in the report of the Property Committee.

There was no Old Business.

Meeting adjourned at 1:00 pm with prayer.




BORGER - Peter Marsh, 79, died Sunday, May 8, 2011.
